# 'Cat Swimmers Third

ANDERSON — Muncie Central's swimming team, placing third in the Anderson sectional swimming tournament Saturday, has qualified five athletes for competition in the state meet to be held Friday and Saturday at Ball State in Muncie.

Anderson won its own sectional, piling up 90 points, and Richmond was second with 64. The Bearcats, scoring three victories

and three seconds, had 56 points and were followed by two other Muncie teams — Burris with 20 and Northside with 17.

Other team scores were Pendleton Heights 14, Connersville 12, Greenfield 7, New Castle 5, Yorktown 1. Muncie Southside and Madison Heights failed to score.

The Bearcat winners were Jim Hagen in the 200-yard individual medley, Tom Hinshaw in the 100-yard freestyle event and Central's 440-yard freestyle relay team of Hagen, Dale Mallon, Gary Perrin and Hinshaw. Their time was a school record 3:31.5.

Also qualifying for the state tournament by virtue of seconds were Bearcats Mallon in the 50-yard freestyle, Don Kratz in diving and Perrin in the 100-yard butterfly.

Chuck Price of Burris also qualified for the state tournament by placing second in the 100-yard backstroke.

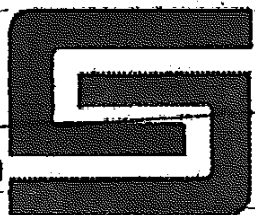

# Bloomington Is Swim Champ

Perhaps it's only natural that Bloomington High School won the state high school swimming championship at Ball State pool Saturday for the second straight year.

After all, Bloomington, Ind., might well be called the swimming capital of Indiana — if not the nation — since it is home base for Indiana University's national collegiate swim champions.

Everybody's in the swim of things in Bloomington and the BHS Panthers left enough opponents in their foamy wake Saturday to grab the win.

The Panthers won only three

individual events but piled up enough finishes near the top to accumulate 47½ points to edge its near neighbor Columbus with 42. Third place went to South Bend Jackson with 37½ and Southport was fourth with 25.

Bloomington swimmers were involved in the only record breaking and tying of the day. The Panthers' Jack Deppe won the 100-yard backstroke in 54.6 seconds, knocking 2.2 seconds off the previous record time which he established last year.

And Bloomington's Mike Kearney captured the 100-yard butterfly in 53.5, equalling the record established by Pat O'Connor of Indianapolis Cathedral last year.

Other swimmers besides Deppe who successfully defended their 1970 state titles were Rick Roberts of Kokomo, who won both the 200- and 400-yard freestyle events for the second year in a row; Craig Edwards of Columbus in the 100-yard breaststroke, and Southport's Eric Brunoehler in diving.

Deppe clinched Bloomington's monopoly of honors by being selected for the IHSA board of control award for outstanding swimming and mental attitude.

It was not a big day for Muncie schoolboy swimmers, Central was the only team to gain the finals and scored in two events to gain nine points and a 12th-place finish.

The Bearcat point-getters were Gary Perrin for his fourth-place finish in the 100-yard butterfly and Central's 400-yard freestyle relay squad. (Jim Hagen, Dale Mallon, Perrin and Tom Henschaw).

## State Swim Meet Opens Here Today

Action will begin tonight at the Ball State University Pool in the 34th annual state high school swim meet.

Trials in diving, the 200-yard medley and the 400-yard freestyle relays will be held beginning at 6 o'clock.

More trials are set to begin at 9 a.m. Saturday. Finals will start at 2:30 p.m.

Bloomington is the defending champion and has 13 individuals and two relay teams entered. Munster also has 13 individuals and two relay teams qualified.

Both Columbus and South Bend Jackson qualified 11 individuals and two relay teams. Hammond Noll is represented by nine in-

dividuals and two relay teams and South Bend Adams by one relay team and nine individuals.

Central has five individuals and one relay team. Burris qualified one swimmer.

### DeSoto and Wes-Del Cage Teams Advance

DeSoto and Wes-Del teams advanced in county junior high school tournament action after winning semifinal round games Thursday night.
