# North swimmers take regional championship

PENDLETON—Muncie Northside's swimming team scored 288 points in splashing past 11 teams here Saturday to win the Pendleton high school swim sectional.

The Titans, displaying both depth and balance, qualified six individuals and both its relay teams for this week's state finals at Ball State University.

Coach Howard Bunch's swimming Titans also set three of the six record performances that went into the record book.

North's records came in the 200-yard individual medley, where Jim Watkins won in 2:09.693 to better the mark 2:10.30 he set a year ago; in the 100-yard backstroke, in which Greg Beyerl covered the distance in 56.3 seconds, nearly a second better than the 1 minute flat he put into the record book in qualifications just a day earlier, and in the 400-yard freestyle relay.

North's 400-relay team of Jay Allardt, Tom Schranz, Jim Hall and Watkins won in 3:30.105. The old mark of 3:31.3 was set by Anderson in 1972.

North also won with its 200-yard medley relay team of Beyerl, Bill Gruppe, Allardt and Hall in non-record time of 1:46.798.

Anderson, qualifying two individuals and one relay team for the state finals, was North's closest pursuer with 202 points. Richmond was third with 187 points, the Red Devils qualifying four and one relay team. Other schools and their point totals with state qualifiers in parentheses:

## Munster wins swim crown

Munster has become the monster of Indiana high school swimming competition.

The Munster swimmers not only ran off with a repeat triumph in the IHSAA's state meet Saturday at Ball State University Pool, but the Mustangs piled up a point total that may well stand a long time.

Munster displayed awesome team depth in scoring 250 points, 59 more than the then-record number the Mustangs put on the board a year ago. South Bend Adams placed second with 196 points—five more than Munster's winning total a year ago.

Other schools in the top 10 were South Bend Jackson 117, Hammond Noll 80, Warren Central 60, Decatur Central 52, Lafayette 48, Muncie Northside 46, Frankfort 43 and South Bend Clay 34. There were 32 teams in all, including Blackford with nine points.

Seven records fell during the competition, two of them by Mark Mamula of South Bend Clay. Mamula, who won the Herman Keller Award for Mental Attitude, set a record in successfully defending his title in the 200-yard individual medley and also smashed a four-year-old mark in the 100-yard butterfly.

Dan Harrigan of South Bend Adams was also a double winner, winning the 200-yard freestyle in record time and capturing the 500-yard freestyle, a new event this year.

Northside, finishing eighth, got a fourth-place finish from its 200-yard medley relay team of Jay Allardt, Greg Beyerl, Bill Gruppe and Jim Hall.

The Titans' 400-yard freestyle relay team of Allardt, Hall, Tom Schranz and Jim Watkins won the consolation flight. North also got points from Watkins' fourth place finish in the consolation heat of the 200-yard individual medley; Watkins' fifth in the 500-free consolation, and Beyerl's third in the 100-yard backstroke consolation.
