Triple winners Tuesday night were George Irving and Jeff Stephens of Central.

Irving was a winner in the 200 and 500 free-style events and anchored the winning 400 freestyle relay squad. Heset a new school record in the 500. freestyle, the fourth time he has shattered the record this year.

Stephens' triumphs were in the 200 individual medley, 100 backstroke, and as leadoff man on the winning 200

ANDERSON — "Bench strength" weighed the balance in favor of Muncle Northside Saturday afternoon as the Titans splashed to their third Sectional swim title in four years, and their fourth in the last five seasons, "North and Anderson are about equal as far as individual 'stars' are concerned," observed Titan swim coach Howard Bunch after his youngsters nudged the Indians, 330-317 in, the race for first place. Yorktown's surprising third-place finish—and the Tigers' stunning victory over North in the 400 freestyle relays—caused some breath-gasping among the point leaders. Especially was this true when it appeared that Anderson might pick up the necessary points to replace North in the team lead department.

The Titans experienced a bad break during Saturday morning's diving preliminaries when their ace in the event Kenny Krats, broke his hand when he fell against the boards during a dive.

"We could have picked up additional points in this event in the finals—athough that is merely conjecture," Bunch said.

The three state qualifiers in the 200 freestyle — Tom Schafer, Anderson, Andy Tharp, and George Butterfield, both of North, in thei-order — were less than two-tenths of a second apart in splashing past the finish line.

Two Indians joined two Titans in getting state recognition in the 200 individual mediev. And another quartet got the nod in the 50 freestyle in a blanket finish in which North's Brian Allardt tied the sectional record of 122,736.

Allardt set a new Northside school record in the 100 freestyle in which Anderson's Scott Craig set a new meet record by finishing in :48.787. Allardt's time was '48.897, and both men qualified for next Saturday's state meet at Ball State University. Another blanket finish resulted in the 100 butterfly with two Titans and one Indian involved.

In the long distance 500 freestyle, Anderson's Schafer ran off from the rest of the field. The Indian ace was timed in 4:55.738 as compared with the 5:02.857 recorded by George Butterfield. North. However, both lads qualified for the state meet.

Bret Sauer, Anderson, barely beat Tim Courtney, North, to the wire in the 100 backstroke. However, two others in that event got under the state standard of 1:00.8. They were Bud Roby, Anderson, and Jack Stephens, Muncie Central.

Bruce Wolf, Yorktown' qualified for the state meet by finishing third in the 50 freestyle.


