State marks fall in swimmeet here

State records were shattered Friday in the 42nd annual Indiana High School men's swimming meet in University Pool at Ball State. Competition for the championships was underway today.

North Central, a team that won the preliminaries, broke one of those records when it finished with a time of 3:15.583 in the 400-yard-reestyle relays. The original record-was set in 1974 by Munster at 3:16.073.

Just behind North Central was Crown Point, the 1978 state runnerup to South Bend Riley.

The second new state record was in the 200 yard individual medley when Curt Reynolds of Warren Central finished in time of 1:55.217. The former mark was held by Seth Bretscher of Valparaiso.

A third record disappeared when Gray Greg Smith of Anderson was timed in :54.537 in the 100-yard backstroke.

Muncie squads qualified only one individual in the championship round, but Northside's relay team will compete in the consolation division.

In the 100 butterfly, North's Pete Voss was the third fastest and was to swim in the finals this afternoon. Spencer Gilbert of Muncie Central barely missed being in the finals, finishing seventh in the 100 breaststroke.

Voss was timed at :53.661 in the butterfly, with Phil Seaman, Crown Point, finishing first in :53.102.

Munster and South Bend Riley each qualified 10 swimmers in individuals events. Other teams with possible potential to win are Anderson, North Central, Valparaiso Hammond Noll and Crown Point.

Competition also resumed today for 48 divers who will be going for 12 places.

Local divers include Randy Keihn and Bob Peacock of Delta; Roger Weiss, Muncie North, and Steve Srehart of Anderson.

Munster wins swim title, Titans are 5th, Central 7th

Munster High School captured the 42nd annual IHSAA swimming meet Saturday at the Ball State University Pool. South Bend Riley was second among the 73 schools participating. There were 452 swimmers in the competition.

Northside finished in a tie for 15th with Seymour. The Titans scored 29 points.

Central scored 7 points.

Northside's Peter Voss was third in the 100 butterfly and the Titans' relay teams finished third in the 400 freestyle and fourth in the 200 medley.

Central's Spencer Gilbert won the 100 breaststroke consolation and North's Tim Courtney was third in the 100 backstroke consolation.

Curt Reynolds of Warren Central won the Herman F. Keller Mental Attitude award. He won the 100-yard backstroke and the 200-yard individual medley. He set a state record in the medley.
