litans, ligers are tourney favorites

Northside and Yorktown wil go in as favorites, but both coaches say it's going to be a struggle trying to finish first in their respective IHSAA boys swimming sectionals beginning Thursday.

Five teams representing Muncie and Delaware County will compete at two sites.

Northside and Delta will be at South Adams, while Yorktown, Central and Southside will swim at Richmond.

Both sectionals start Thursday at 5:30 p.m., with preliminary competition in all events except diving. Saturday's action starts with diving at 9 a.m., followed by consolations and finals in other events beginning at 2 p.m.

Northside is defending champion at South Adams and Coach Bob Chico thinks his team is capable of repeating.

"I think we could win it again, but the competition has tightened up considerably this year," Chico said. "We should be right in the chase with Marion and Huntington."

Other teams competing include Delta, Jay County, Bellmont, Blackford, Bluffton, Norwell and host South Adams.

The Titans, who posted a 6-4-1 dual-meet record, have several swimmers capable of advancing to



the state meet.

"I think we could take quite a few swimmers to state if things go right for us," Chico said.

The top finisher in each sectional event advances to the state meet as do all swimmers who break a state standard time set before the season by the IHSAA.

The only other way to advance to state is to swim one of the top 32 times in the state. Should an event not have enough qualifiers to make a 32-member field, swimmers with the next fastest times (who didn't advance) will be picked up.

There is an exception in diving, where the top three individuals advance to state.

The Titans have four No. 1 seeds for the sectional: Steve Hoffman in the 100-yard breaststroke; Doug Coers, 100 butterfly; Mark Fortier, 100 backstroke, and the 200 medley relay team of Hoffman, Coers, Fortier and Rick Brown.

Seeded second are diver Chris

Dague and the 400-freestyle relay capable of placing high, including team of Bowen, Doug Piazza, Tom Lane and Leland Wilhoite.

Delta recently completed the most successful dual-meet season in its nine-year swimming history, posting a 10-4 record.

"We've had a very good season, but we don't have many statecaliber swimmers yet," Eagle coach Tom Devine said. "We do have a couple of swimmers with a chance to go to state."

Jeff Koester is the top-seeded diver, while Ryan Wantz is seeded third in 200 freestyle and fourth in 100 butterfly.

Tim Kress is seeded fourth in 100 breaststroke, as is the medley relayteam of Kress, Wantz, Kim Gill and Mike Shideler.

Yorktown is expected to be in a three-way race for the Richmond sectional crown.

"We'll definitely finish in the top three," Tiger Coach Jay Ettl said. "Where in the top three is just a matter of how well we swim."

The Tigers, who finished the year with a 7-2-2 record, will get stiff competition-from Anderson Highland and Anderson.

Other teams competing in the sectional include Central, South-Heights, Centerville, Connersville, Hagerstown and New Castle.

Yorktown, which finished third a year ago, has several swimmers Doug Green, diving, Robert Werling, 50 freestyle, and Brett Yarbough, 50 freestyle.

Werling has advanced to state each of the last two years in the 50 freestyle.

The Tigers' freestyle relay team sports the fastest time in the sectional field. The team will consist of Brad Hicks, Doug Fullenwider, Yarbough and either Werling or David Brown.

Yorktown's medley relay team, which is seeded third, includes Werling, Fullenwider, Eric Mc-Neely and Rick Winegardner.

Southside coach John Phillips hopes the Rebels can repeat the sixth-place finish they managed last season.

The Rebels finished with a 7-10 dual-meet record.

"Realistically, we're shooting for sixth place," Phillips said. "There are five teams ahead of us that we can't catch, so we hope to beat the rest of the field."

Top performers for South include Brian Hahn, diving and backstroke: Ty Gill, 50- and 100- freestyle, and Bill Nelson, 50 freestyle and butter-

Phillips also hopes for a high side, host Richmond, Madison finish by his freestyle relay team of Gill, Brad Armstrong, Brian Scott and Rick Abbott.

Central Coach Brian Hay was not available for comment.

Yorktown qualified two relay teams and seven individuals for the finals at the Richmond sectional.

Saturday's final round at both sites will begin with diving at 9 a.m., followed by swim consolations and finals at 2 p.m.

The top six swimmers in each event advanced to the championship round, while the second six swimmers will compete in a consolation round.

The winner in each championship event qualifies for next weekend's state meet at the IUPUI Natatorium in Indianapolis.

"I think we did pretty well," Titan Coach Bob Chico said. "If we were to stop the meet right now, we'd be in first, Marion second and Jay County and Huntington close for third."

The Titans had four first-place finishes in qualifying. Winners were Steve Hofmann in 100-yard breaststroke, Doug Coers in 100 butterfly, Mark Fortier in 100 backstroke and the 200 medley relay team of Coers, Fortier, Hofmann and Rick Bowen.

"I think if we swim up to our capabilities Saturday, we can win the meet," Chico added. "Things went pretty much like we figured they would.

Delta had no individual winners, but qualified two relays and three individuals for the championship round.

Yorktown finished the qualifying round at the Richmond sectional in third place. But Tiger Coach Jay Ettl hopes to move up.

"We swam well, but not as well Control of the contro

Northside and Yorktown are in od position for strong finishes aturday in their respective IHSAA results Saturday and I think we might be able to move up to second place.'

Anderson has a big advantage after the qualifying round, advancing two relays and 14 individuals into the championship round.

Anderson Highland advanced two relays and 11 individuals, while Yorktown qualified two relays and seven individuals.

"We're a solid third right now and we haven't had any diving yet," Ettl said. "I hope we can pick up some points there."

Yorktown's only winner was Robert Werling, who was first in the 50 freestyle. He is the defending sectional champion in the event.

Central and Southside also competed in the Richmond sectional. but neither advanced a swimmer to the championship finals.

Titans, Tigers add swimmers for state finals

Northside and Yorktown each received good news today when the IHSAA added swimmers from their teams to the field for this weekend's IHSAA state swim meet.

Northside's Doug Piazza and Yorktown's Rick Winegardner and Brent Yarbrough were added to the state field because their sectional times were among the top 32 in the

The only ways a player can gain a spot in the state meet is by winning his event at sectional or by bettering a state cut time set by the

The only exception is in diving, where the top three individuals

However, when fewer than 32 swimmers advance in any event, the IHSAA*completes the field by picking up the swimmers with the fastest times.

Piazza was timed in 22.78 seconds in finishing seventh in the 50-yard freestyle Saturday at the South Adams sectional.

Winegardner was clocked in 58.81 seconds in the 100 backstroke and Yarbrough in 22.87 in the 50 freestyle. They competed at the Richmond sectional.

Northside won the South Adams sectional, scoring 238 points to outdistance Marion and Huntington, which talled 129 such Jay County

scored 134, Norwell 132 and Delta

Yorktown placed third in the Richmond meet. Anderson won with 296 points followed by Anderson Highland 224 and Yorktown 213. Southside was eighth with 35

Also qualifying for the Titans were two relay teams and four other individuals — all were sectional winners.

INDIANAPOLIS - Steve Hofmann of Muncie Northside finished sixth in 100-yard breaststroke here Saturday to help the Titans place 20th in the team standings of the IHSAA state swim meet.

It marked the third straight year the Titans have finished in the top 20 at the state meet.

Hofmann was clocked at 1.02.61 in the finals. He also combined with teammates Mark Fortier, Doug Coers and Rick Bowen for a 10thplace finish in the 200-yard medley relay

Titan swimmer is still a threat

INDIANAPOLIS - After Friday's preliminary round of the IHSAA boys swim meet, only Northside's Steve Hofmann has a

chance at winning a blue ribbon.

Nine swimmers and three relay teams from Muncie and Delaware County competed in preliminary competition at the IUPUI Natatorium here, but only two individuals and one relay team survived. They were to swim in today's finals.

The top eight finishers in each event qualified for todays finals, while the second eight made the consolations

Northside sent two relay teams and five individuals to the first round, but only Hofmann and the Titan 200-yard medley relay team advanced.

Hofmann made the finals in the 100-yard breaststroke by finishing fifth in a time of 1 02 28 — his best effort of the season.

Hofmann also joined teammates Rick Bowen, Mark Fortier and Doug Coers to qualify ninth in the medley relay. Their time was 1:41.26.

Yorktown sent a relay team and

Yorktown sent a relay team and three individuals, but only sophomore Robert Werling advanced. Werling qualified ninth in the 50-yard freestyle in :22.1.

Several other local individuals placed well. Northside diver Chris Dague placed 33rd. The top 32 advanced to the second round.

Delta's Jeff Koester made it through the first two rounds of diving and wound up finishing 24th. The top 20 divers advance to the final round of competition.

Fortier was 17th in the 100 backstroke—the top 16 advance, and the Titan 400-yard freestyle relay team of Bowen, Leland Wilholte, Tom Lane and Doug Piazza placed 18th—the top 16 advance.
