

Titan swimmers sink Rebels by winning all 11 events

Northside's swimming team took first place in all 11 events Tuesday in a 125-47 victory over Southside in the Central pool.

In other swimming action, Central was victorious at Yorktown, defeating the Tigers 92-79, and Delta fell to Anderson Madison Heights 89-82 in the Delta pool.

Chuck East of Delta set a school record by swimming the 50-yard freestyle in 22.61 seconds.

Swim sectionals open tonight for local teams

After losing its three-year hold on the South Adams sectional crown to Delta last year, Northside's swimming team will be out to regain the title starting tonight.

Also beginning tonight is the Richmond sectional, at which Central, Southside and Yorktown will compete.

Both sectionals begin with preliminaries at 5:30 o'clock at South Adams and 5 o'clock at Richmond. Diving competition begins at 9 a.m. Saturday at both sites, with consolation races and finals starting at 2 p.m.

Delta edged Northside by just four points, 202-198, at last year's sectional. This year both are favorites to finish toward the top of the sectional heap.

North, 5-3, seems to have the advantage because the Titans return almost every swimmer from last year's second-place squad.

Delta finished 10-3 during the regular season.

Returning sectional champs for North include Leland Wilhoite in the 100-yard butterfly and the 200 medley relay team of Wilhoite,

Greg Bowen, Walker Marsh and Doug Phippen.

Marsh finished third in the backstroke last season. He will also compete in the freestyle event this season.

Delta returns defending sectional champion Mike Klein, who won both the 100 backstroke and the 200 freestyle last season.

Other top swimmers for Delta include Chuck East, a freestyler, and Doug Souffrant, who swims the breaststroke.

Other teams competing in the South Adams sectional will be Huntington North, Jay County, Marion, Norwell, Blackford, Belmont, Bluffton, Adams Central and South Adams.

At Richmond, Anderson dominated the sectional last year by defeating runner-up Richmond 335-187.

South finished seventh last year. Central was 10th and Yorktown 10th.

Other teams at Richmond are Anderson Highland, Anderson Madison Heights, Centerville, Connersville, Hagerstown and New Castle.

Titans advance 10 to swim finals

Northside dominated Thursday's preliminary round of the South Adams swimming sectional at Berne by advancing 10 boys into Saturday's finals.

At the preliminaries of the Richmond-sectional Thursday, Yorktown and Central each qualified four individuals for Saturday's competition.

Team scores are not kept in the preliminary rounds of sectionals. Scores will be kept starting Saturday when consolations and finals begin at 2 p.m. at both sites.

In the South Adams sectional, Northside, in addition to the 10 swimmers it advanced to the finals, placed eight individuals in Saturday's consolations. Both Northside relay teams will be the No. 1 seeds in the finals.

Delta stayed in contention by advancing nine swimmers and both relay teams into the finals. The Eagles also placed four swimmers

into the consolations. Behind Delta was Jay County with four swimmers advancing into the finals and one into the consolation round.

For North, Leland Wilhoite will be top seed in the 100-yard butterfly. Delta's Chuck East will be top seeded in the 100 freestyle.

At Richmond, Yorktown had two swimmers advance to the finals and two to the consolations. Central's qualifiers will swim in the consolations.

Yorktown, Southside and Central advanced their relay teams into Saturday's consolations.

Yorktown's two finalists are Dave Brown and Jeff Riggs.

Brown qualified in both the 50 freestyle and the 100 freestyle. Riggs advanced in the 100 breaststroke.

Northside captures swimming sectional

Four individuals and two relay teams are all that will represent Delaware County in the IHSAA state swimming meet this weekend after sectional competition during the weekend.

Two of the individuals and both relay teams are from Northside, which easily swam to the team championship in an 11-team sectional at South Adams. The other two individual state meet qualifiers are from Delta, which was runnerup in the standings.

Coach Bob Chico's Northside Titans won the South Adams Sectional with 274 team points. The Eagles were a distant second with 180.

Three other local teams competed in sectional competition at Richmond, and didn't fare as well. No local swimmers qualified for the state meet through the Richmond Sectional.

Yorktown was the top local team finisher there, placing seventh with 62 points after a last-place finish last year. Central

was ninth with 28 and Southside 10th with 20 points.

Anderson outdueled host Richmond 307½-283½ to win the team championship.

Walker Marsh advanced for the Titans after finishing in a first-place tie in the 100-yard backstroke event, and teammate Mike Chauvin qualified with a third-place finish in diving. The Titans' 200-yard medley and 400-yard freestyle relay teams also qualified for the state meet with first-place finishes in Saturday's tourney.

Chuck East qualified in two events for Delta, and teammate Mike Klein also qualified.

East won both the 50- and 100-yard freestyle events to advance to the state, while Klein won the 200-meter freestyle.

The winner in each event, and the top three finishers in diving, advance to the state meet at the Indiana University Natatorium at Indiana University Purdue University-Indianapolis. State finals are Friday and Saturday.

TITANS 11TH IN 200-YARD MEDLEY

North relay team places at state

INDIANAPOLIS — Northside and Yorktown scored team points, but were well out of the running for the team title at the IHSAA state swimming finals last weekend at the Indiana University-Purdue University Natatorium.

Lake Central captured its first swimming state title by nipping North Central (Indianapolis) 167-165. Columbus North placed third with 159, followed by Anderson (152), Munster (137) and Valparaiso (109).

The highest finishing local swimmers were the 200-yard medley relay team from Northside. Walker Marsh, Greg Bowen, Leland Wilhoite and John Marshall teamed for an 11th-place finish with a time of 1:41.65.

Yorktown got its points from David Brown, whose 49.24-second clocking was the 14th-place finisher in the 100-yard freestyle event.

Northside also had two individuals and a relay team that competed but didn't place. Marsh placed 29th in the 100-yard backstroke, while Mike Chavin advanced to the semifinals but had to settle for a 20th-place finish in diving.

Delta had two individuals competing in three events and a relay team at the state meet, but failed to score any team points.

Chuck East was 19th and posted his best time ever of :22.54 in the 50-yard freestyle. East also swam in the 100-yard freestyle and finished in 31st place.

Also, Mike Klein set a school

record with a 1:48.88 clocking in the 200-yard freestyle. Klein was 24th in that event. Delta's 400-yard freestyle relay team of East, Klein, Brad Welsh and Doug Souffrant placed 17th.

A victory in 1-meter diving by Jim Dunavant and a second-place finish in the 500-freestyle by teammate Paul Uttley helped Lake Central to the 1987 team championship.

It was the first state swimming title for Lake Central, which edged Indianapolis North Central 167-165.

Dunavant scored 425.15 points to capture the diving crown easily.

He was in 13th place after Friday night's preliminaries but improved to ninth after Saturday morning's semifinals. Teammate Mike Ewing

finished ninth.

"Our two divers were a big advantage for us," said Lake Central Coach Jim Tonkovich.

Four meet records were set Saturday. In the 100-yard butterfly, South Bend Riley's Brad Toothaker set a record of 49.59, bettering his own record of 49.62 set last year.

Toothaker, who also won the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 1:53.42, was given the Herman F. Keller Mental Attitude Award.

Crawfordsville's Josh Mikesell won his third straight 100-yard backstroke gold, setting a meet record of 51.87 and bettering his own record of 52.46 set last year.

Munster's 200-yard medley relay team finished in 1:36.91, bettering Anderson's 1986 record of 1:37.94.

Todd Griner of Anderson set a record in the 200-yard freestyle, his 1:40.10 replacing the 1982 record of 1:40.66 set by Jeff Holowach of North Central.
