## Central and Delta combine to advance 30 in swim sectional

PORTLAND - Muncie Central got some redemption in Thursday night's Jay County sectional swimming preliminaries, but Delta qualified more swimmers than the No. 12 Bearcats for Saturday afternoon's final.

Central, stripped of a sectional record in the 200 medley relay a year ago, set another one Thursday with a time of 1:41.72.

The team, which consisted of Ryan Bowman, Adam Cairns, Jeremy Johns and Nick Rundell, sliced one-tenth of a second off the record previously owned by Anderson Highland.

"That was especially pleasing." Central coach Bob. Chico said. "We were deprived of it last season with sort of a silly rule infraetion, so it was nice to get it back."

The defending sectional champion Bearcats qualified 14 for the finals and nine for the consolation

"We lost a few places, we picked up a few places," Chico said. "Overall, we're pleased."

the most finals qualifiers -16. The Eagles put six into the consolation round.


a "We're very pleased," Delta coach Tim Brannock said. "My impression is that we look pretty good at this point. It's what we were looking for — we swam as well as we could have. I think we improved our times in every race.

Central finished first in seven of the 11 events. Leading the way for the 'Cats' were Bowman, who collected firsts in the 50-yard frecstyle and 500 freestyle, and Rundell, first in the 200 individual medley and 100 butterfly. Cairns was first in the 100 breaststroke.

Yorktown qualified 1-1 for the finals and seven for the consolation round, with its two top finishes coming from Ryan Liddy in the 50 freestyle and 100 freestyle. Jay County will be in the finals

with its 400 freestyle relay and has seven in the consolation. Blackford qualified four for the consolation, and Muncie Southside qualified three.

Diving preliminaries will start at 9 a.m. Saturday, and finals in all events will begin at 2 p.m. at



## Central swimmers repeat as sectional champs

PORTLAND — Muncie Central used eight first-place finishes, including a sectional record in the 200-yard medley relay, to hold off Delta and win its third boys' swimming sectional in years Saturday at Jay County, Central, ranked No. 12, got past second-place Delta, 288-263, Yorktown, with 212 points, finished fourth behind third-place sectional newcomer Norwell.

The Bearcats' medley relay, team of Jeremy, Johns, Adam Cairns, Nick Rundell and Ryan Bowman broke the record it set Thursday in the preliminaries with a time of 1:40.47. That beat the old record by more than a second.

The sectional title is the second in a row for the Cats, "Our seniors have won two North Central coach Bob Chico said, so they leave with a pretty good record. Our seniors did a super job."

Delta coach Tim Brannock was named sectional coach of the year in honor of his team's performance.

"I'm so happy for these kids who have worked so hard. It's been a good day for us," Chico said. "We qualified two swimmers for the U.S. Junior National Championships. It's great. It's exhilarating.'

Homestead's Justin Hoggatt became the first swimmer in 40 years to win three consecutive state final 50 freestyle races.
