CATS, OWL QUALIFY FOR SWIMMING MEET

Central will send two relays teams and five individuals to the state swimming meet Saturday and Burris will send one.

The Bearcats and Owls qualified swimmers in Saturday's sectional at Frankfort, which was won by Kokomo with 83.5 points and Central finished second with 60. Burris was sixth.

The 200-yard medley relay team of Mike Abrell, Clark Crouse, Tom Perrin and Paul Laberteaux won in 1:05.5 and the team of Crouse, Jim Webb, Bill Fulton and Laberteaux won the 400-yard freestyle event.

Individuals qualifying were Perrin, winner of the 100-yard butterfly; Webb, second in the 50-yard freestyle; Abrell, second in the 100-yard backstroke; Jerry Green, third in the 400-yard freestyle; Steve Page, fourth in the 200-yard individual medley relay.

Burris' qualifier was diver Bruce Phillips, who finished second.

Central Wins Swim Crown

ANDERSON — Muncie Central's swimming team qualified one relay team and four individuals for the state IHSAA meet next Saturday by capturing the Anderson sectional title Saturday afternoon.

It was the Bearcats' first swimming sectional title.

In winning, the Central tankers piled up 69 points, topping runnerup Fort Wayne Snider by 12 points. Anderson was third with 40½. Other team scores:

Richmond 39, Burris 30, Marion 21½, Madison Heights 21, New Castle 4, Fort Wayne North 4, Fort Wayne Catholic 0 and Hamilton Southeastern 0.

Central's qualifiers for the state meet included the winning 400-yard freestyle relay team (Gary Perrin, Bob Maryan, Dale Mallon and John Lewis). Also advancing as individuals were Lewis in the 100-yard freestyle, Perrin in the 100-yard butterfly, Jim Hagen in the 200-yard individual medley, and Mike Moore in the 400-yard freestyle.

Lewis, Perrin and Hagen were winners in their events and Moore was a runnerup.

Burris also qualified two swimmers for the state meet at the Indiana University pool in Bloomington Saturday. They are Steve Dunham, who was sectional runnerup in the 200-yard freestyle, and Chuck Price, second in the individual medley.
