





"Boys don't want to be beat by girls, and girls want to beat the boys so they pushed each others," said Cairns.


Some team members were apprehensive when they first heard about the new idea, but it turned out to be a positive experience, bringing everyone together.



Beasley finished his run at 23.19, and as Hill dove into the pool, the chant of "Devon," began.

Hill finished his lap in 22.37, then senior anchor Rob Coombes, blasted off the block. Coombes, who'd never broken 22 seconds in a 50 split, held the fate of the relay in his hands.

The pool began to feel and sound like a sold out Colt's playoff game.

"I knew in my mind that they could get it, they worked so hard for it," junior Sara Proctor said.

Coombes went a personal best split of 21.76, beating the previous 1992 pool record of 1:30.15 by less than a second. The relay posted a time of 1:29.71.

"When I swam at Catalina, Nathan Bowman was my coach -- he was on the relay team that we broke -- and he was a big influence in my swimming career," Coombes said. "I feel that we broke a legend's record."





