


Full swim team of 40 strong; rebuild under new coach

With 40 swimmers and divers, and a new coach, the girls's swim team struggled to find consistancy.

"We had a new coach and lost a lot of swimmers from last year," said junior Katie Flatter. Coach Shelly Fullhart, a former Muncie Central

swimmer and tennis player, returned from a two-year residence in Colorado to coach in her hometown. Fullhart brought not only a new coaching style to the program, but also positive reinforcement and team unity from past years.

"Shelly didn't think that morning or Saturday practices were needed," said senior Amy Spade. "We just had to work harder when we did have practice."

"She always had a positive attitude and made sure everyone felt like part of the team," said sophomore Katy Reno.

With a 4-7 record, the team kept their stamina and spirits high to end out the season.

"We swam a lot of good teams and also had really close scores in three of our meets," said junior Lauren

Staggs. The teams from Hamilton Southeastern and Richmond were both state-ranked, and let their talents show against the Bearcats. Against New Castle, Anderson and Jay County, the team was within only three points of

"We had a lot of close meets and ended up doing pretty well at the NCC," said freshman Laura Tucker. The girls finished in fifth place at NCC, held at the University of Indianapolis Natatorium, behind the teams from Richmond, Kokomo, Lafayette Jeff and New Castle. Staggs finished third place in the 100 yd. butterfly and sixth in the 200 yd. freestyle. Other top finishers included seniors Spade and Allison Demaree in the 100 yd. breastroke and 50 yd. freestyle, respectively.


Senior diver Meredith Demaree finished in sixth place

at the NCC. The four- member diving team was coached by Ball State student Shannon Huston. Following the NCC competition, the members of the girls' swimming and diving team enjoyed wins over Yorktown and Southside, after which the team prepared for sectional preliminary competition held on Feb. 3, and finale or Feb. 5 at Hamilton Southsactorn finals on Feb. 5 at Hamilton Southeastern.

"We started tapering two weeks before sectionals and had a really good feeling about it," said freshman Heather Lyon.

'We were really happy with our sectional swims. A lot of underclassmen stepped up," said Spade. The team advanced 12 swimmers to the final and








