Slow first season for tankers; keglers shoot high




Tied for second, Mike Rosenbaum and Robert Young followed Hardwick's pace with a notable 238, to end the year for the bowling sport.



If our kids would have been swimming all their lives, like the kids from Northside with their swim clubs, we could be just as tough as they are," continued Rhorman.

Another set-back occured when last year's "Most Valuable Swimmer" Joe Slater moved out of the school district. "Any time you loose your MVP, its bound to hurt your teams chances," stated Rhorman.

Looking forward to next year, Coach Rhorman expects the team to be greatly improved, "We're only loosing two seniors, and if everyone comes out next year, we're going to be alot better."

When asked about female swimmers on the varsity team, Coach Rhorman stated, "If it were OK'd by the ISHAA, and if they could win, I wouldn't care."









Swimmers finish 6-12



They lost twelve meets and won only six. Sixteen swimmers made up the team including Allison Ruttan (9) the girl to qualify for the team.



"The Sectional competition also had a poor outcome," concluded Coach Phillips.




SOUTH SWIMMERS "Get Set" to swim the length of the pool during a competitive meet.

Coach John Phillip's varsity swimming team struggled through the past season with a record of 3-16-1.


