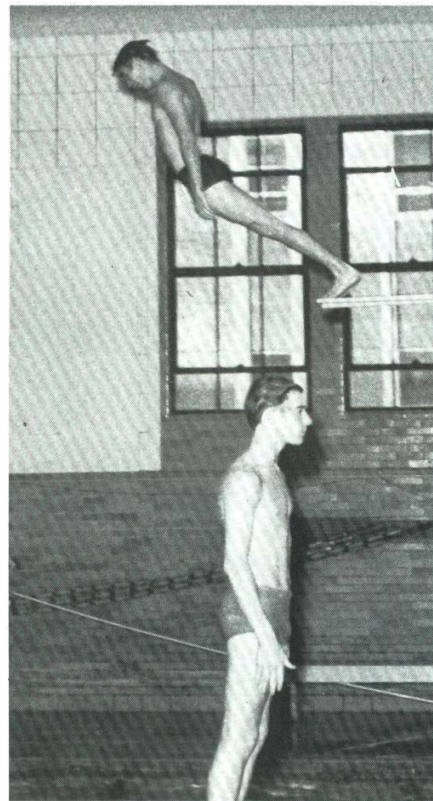
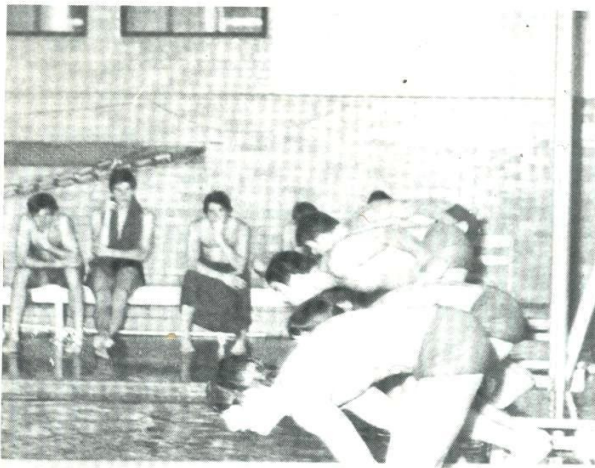
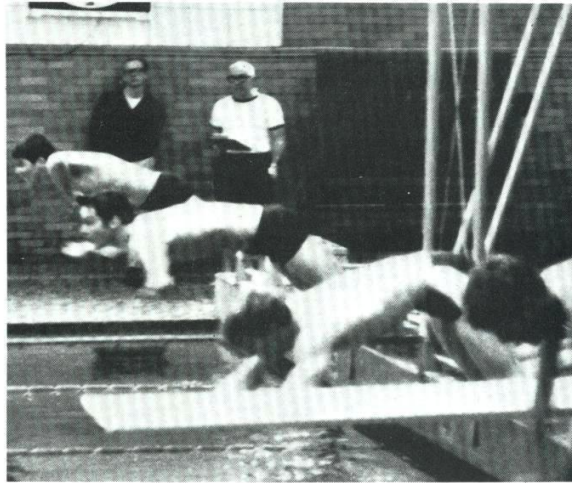


1970: 7-7; Price Sets Two School Records
